Educating individuals to build healthy, sustainable, personal, family, and community relationships. Multi-week classes for men, women, and teens that utilize a proven curriculum teaching individuals to develop strong healthy relationships.

The "Learning to Live, Learning to Love" curriculum is a proven, faith-based program which teaches students to recognize, deal with, and overcome root causes of destructive behavior.

Those willing to commit to using the concepts taught on an ongoing basis truly are seeing marked improvement in their individual lives. This makes for a much stronger, happier, healthier family.

- Classes run 30 weeks
- Fees are determined on a sliding scale based on income, initial cost \$50. Additional classes based on sliding scale.
- Next classes are scheduled to start in September.
 Class size is limited, and fills quickly. New classes do not start until there are enough students to fill a class. Must start at beginning, cannot enter after second class.
- Classes are taught in English in Hood River and/or The Dalles.




HAPA - Hombres Autoresponsables para Parar el Abuso (Men Responsible for Stopping Abuse) – in Spanish

The mission of HAPA is to end abuse and family violence by ending all controlling behaviors in domestic relationships that cause physical, psychological, and sexual violence. HAPA meetings serve Spanish-speaking men who have hurt their partners and families through the use of control, abuse, or violence in Hood River, Wasco, Klickitat and Skamania counties. HAPA helps participants end abusive behavior, build trusting relationships and heal from the effects of violence and abuse. All services are confidential.

- 48 weekly sessions are required to complete the course with a certificate
- New participants may join at any time
- Sessions are held every Friday, 6:00 8:00 p.m.
- Sessions are held at The Next Door: 965 Tucker Rd., Hood River
- Cost: Intake is \$65.00 plus an additional \$45.00 per session thereafter

EMERGENCY KIT CHECKLIST

Food, at least a three-day supply of nonperishable food

Water, one gallon of water per person
and pet per day for at least three days, for
drinking and sanitation

Radio, battery-powered or hand crank
with NOAA weather and tone alert

Flashlight, headlamp, extra
batteries for radio and lights

First aid kit

Whistle to signal for help

Dust mask or cotton t-shirt to filter air

Moist towelettes, garbage bags, plastic ties for personal sanitation

Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities. Know where and how shut off valves.

Manual can and bottle openers, plates, utensils, paper towels

Maps and documents - insurance information, contact information, family emergency plan, etc.

Coats, shoes, clothing

Unique family needs - prescription medicines, glasses, infant formula, diapers, pet supplies including crates.

Get ready, Gorge!

We live in a beautiful and remote area with weather and natural hazards. Be prepared. Disasters and emergencies can happen at any time.

1. Get a Kit

of emergency supplies.

Be prepared to make it on your own for at least three days, it may be up to three weeks.



If possible, make two kits

- a larger kit at home and a small kit for the car.

2. Make a Plan

for family emergencies.

Sit down together, plan and practice in advance. Your family may not be together when disaster strikes, so plan how you will communicate and meet up and where you will go. If you evacuate, take your emergency supply kit and pets, however public shelters may not allow pets inside.

Set up family meeting points where you can find each other and leave messages if you are separated. Power may be out and cell phones may not be working. Find out how schools and your employer will reach you if needed.

Have an out of state contact that all family members call. If you can't reach each other, it may be easier to make a long-distance call than to call locally. Be sure everyone knows the number and has coins or a prepaid phone card.
